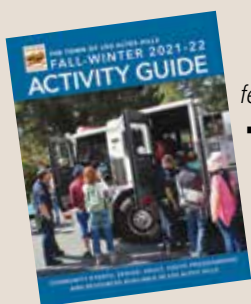
Parks and Recreation Committee meetings are held on the third Monday of every month from 5:30 – 7:00 pm.

Drive-Thru Shred Event

Safe, Convenient, and Environmentally Responsible

The Drive-Thru Shred Event is available to help residents responsibly destroy confidential documents. Residents are invited to bring up to 5 standard file boxes or 5 paper bags of documents to shred. The event is a free service for the residents of Los Altos Hills. Proof of residency will be required prior to accessing the event and social distancing protocol is to be practiced at all times.

Prior to event

1. Remove documents from binders and binder clips as these can damage the equipment.
2. Compile documents into file boxes or paper bags.
3. Place the documents in the trunk of your car for easy hand off at the drive thru.

Credit Cards, Gift Cards, paperclips, staples, and rubber bands are acceptable for shredding. Unacceptable items include (but not limited to): batteries, matches, electronics, metal, cardboard, binders, binder clips, x-rays, CD's, DVD's, plastic sleeves, e-waste, pens, etc. No garbage or non-paper items. Bulk shredding of Credit and/or Gift Cards is accepted but must be packaged separately from paper documents to protect the quality of the recycling.

- House and lawn furniture (e.g. sofas, mattresses, box springs, patio chairs)
- Appliances (e.g. washers, dryers, ranges and water heaters)
- Plastic toys
- Radios and stereos
- Bicycles and exercise equipment
- Pots and pans
- Small metal appliances
- Scrap metal less than 40 pounds and less than 2 feet in length
- Wood waste
- Rock, dirt, asphalt and concrete (NO MORE than 30 gallons per household)
- Construction or demolition debris (NO MORE than 30 gallons per household)
- Tree trimmings less than 6 inches in diameter and less than 6 feet in length
- E-waste (e.g. televisions, computers, laptops)

Items Not Accepted:

- Tires
- Fuel cans or engine parts containing oil, grease, gasoline (e.g. lawn mowers)
- Large amounts of rock, dirt, asphalt and concrete
- Large pieces of plate glass
- Wet garbage
- Items you recycle with your regular service
- Household Hazardous Waste (e.g. compact fluorescent lights and tubes, oil, paints, liquids, chemicals / pesticides, sharps-needles)

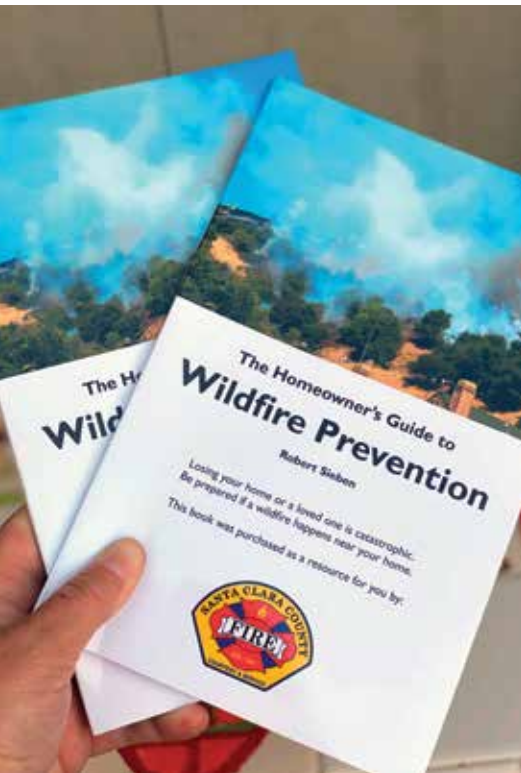

Neighborhood Watch Program

Become a leader in your community

A neighborhood that knows each other is better equipped to report unusual activities to law enforcement. The Neighborhood Watch framework is a program created, run, and maintained by residents near one another to reduce crime by looking out for each other. Through a partnership with the Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office and the Town, residents can advance their neighborhood's security through simple practices and active awareness. In this program, groups of neighboring residents will have an orientation with the Santa Clara County Office of the Sheriff and learn the basics of how a neighborhood watch program works. Upon completing the orientation, each neighborhood group will receive Neighborhood Watch street signs to display on the streets around their homes.

The Town is actively recruiting resident leaders interested in bringing the Neighborhood Watch Program to their community. More communities participating in the Town means a safer community all around.

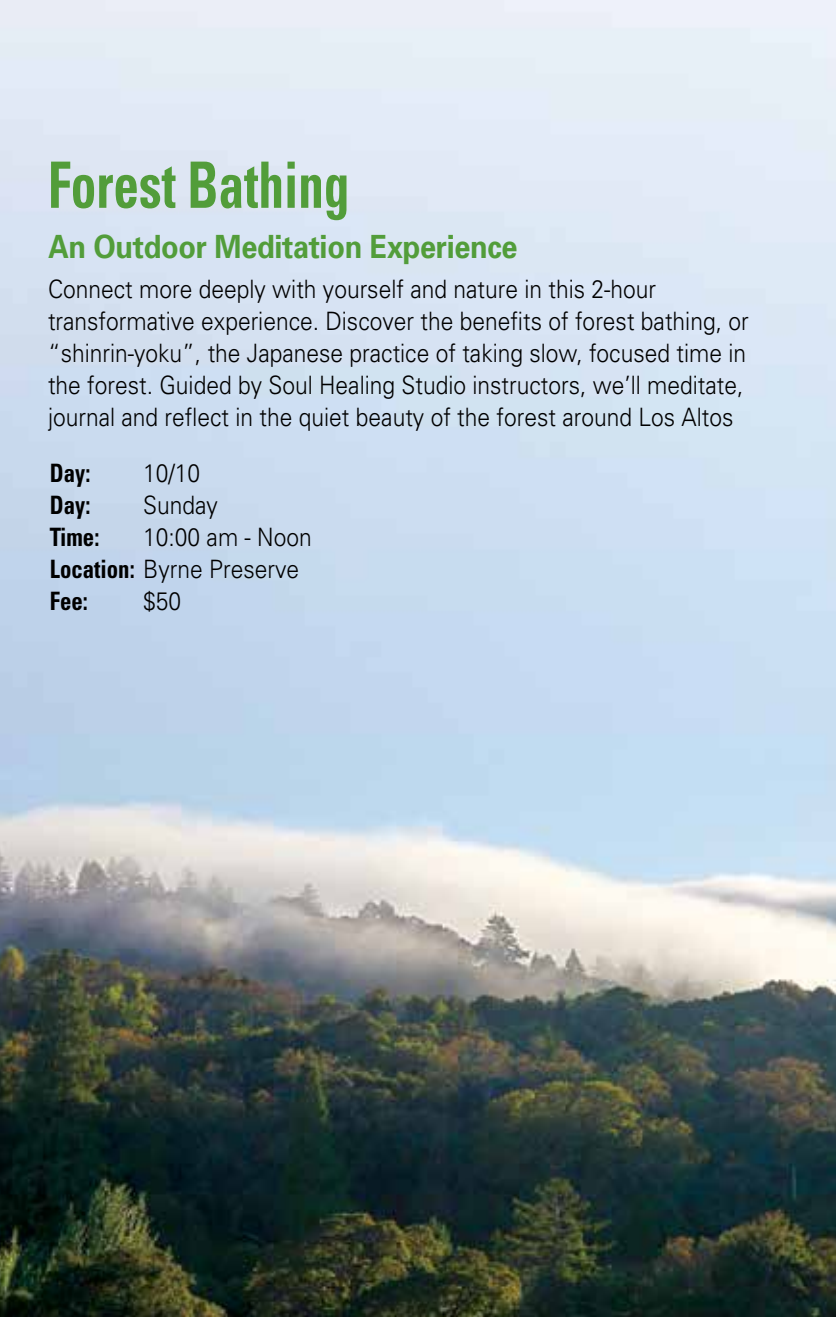

The Los Altos Hills County Fire District (LAHCFD or District) was established in 1939 and serves approximately 12,000 residents, which includes the Town of Los Also Hills and unincorporated areas of Santa Clara County. The mission of LAHCFD is to protect the lives, property and environment within the District it serves from fires, disasters, medical emergencies or other incidents through education, prevention, protection and emergency response services and to be responsible for the financial stewardship of District tax-payer funds.

The District contracts with Santa Clara County Fire Department for fire suppression, emergency medical response and other related fire services. In addition to these contracted services, LAHCFD utilizes emerging fire science principals, guidelines, and technologies to address residents' need for preparedness education, prevention, and mitigation programs.

LAHCFD has a variety of programs available to District residents to help them prepare their families, homes, and properties from wildfires and other natural disasters. LAHCFD's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness and provides them with training in basic disaster response skills. In the Spring of 2021, LAHCFD partnered with the Town of Los Altos Hills to create a Teen CERT Program, providing local teens with disaster response training and unique leadership and community service opportunities. The inaugural class of 19 area teens graduated in June 2021 and the District looks forward to continuing the program this fall.

The District is dedicated to providing programs that build individual and community resiliency, while working with partner agencies to reduce the risk of wildfire. Battery Recycling Program

Batteries contain toxic substances such as lead, mercury, and cadmium and are to be kept out of the trash. GreenWaste Recovery offers a Resident battery recycling program. To recycle small batteries, residents can place the batteries in a clear ziplock (or similar) bag and place the closed bag on top (not inside) of the BLUE Recyclables Cart. It's highly recommended that residents also tape the ends of the batteries, so they don't cause friction with each other in the bag. For car batteries, the residents are advised to contact Santa Clara County Household Hazardous Waste Program at 408.299.7300 or visit www.hhw.org to schedule a drop-off appointment.

GreenWaste's motor oil recycling program

Just phone them to ask for containers and they leave up to three 1-gallon containers. They can also provide plastic bags for filters. Just put your oil and filters in their containers and leave out next to your bins on collection day.

The following are included with your GreenWaste service

Access to two (2) On-Call Clean Up Services for no additional charge. GreenWaste continues to provide this additional service at a time when many haulers have discontinued similar services. Each On-Call Clean Up Service allows the pickup of either one of the following:

- Two (2) bulky items
- OR three (3) cans of Yard Trimmings. Material must be placed Curbside.

Call Customer Service at least 48-hours in advance to schedule collection.

Please Note: Once these two (2) no-charge collections have been exhausted, the service remains available for an additional charge. Call Customer Service at least 48-hours in advance.

Extra Material: Residents may place extra material in labeled 32-gal cans or bags for collection at an additional charge. Further charges apply for collection of extra material on a day other than your regularly scheduled service day. If using bags: Recyclables must be in a clear or translucent bag, and Yard Trimmings must be in a paper bag.

All residents are provided with four (4) Yard Trimmings Vouchers annually for use on your normal collection day. Please see voucher for limitations.

Access to monthly Fire Prevention Events, held on the 3rd Saturday of each month at Foothill College Parking Lot 1 where residents can bring an unlimited amount of yard trimmings from 9:00am – 2:00pm.
