



Town Manager's Report for May 3-7, 2021

Dear Honorable Mayor and members of the City Council,

Items to report on for this week include the following:

Planning and Building Department +Engineering services Report:

EI Monte Fire Station Utility Undergrounding Project

Following the City Council's action at the Special Meeting on April 28th to purchase 4,323,712 Rule 20A Work Credits from the Counties of Mariposa and Trinity, and the City of Willows, staff worked with each jurisdiction to complete the Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs). All three MOUs were executed by May 4th, and they were transmitted to PG&E on May 5th. A copy of the cover letter that accompanied the MOUs is attached. As was shared at the April 28th meeting, PG&E took a position to stop recognizing work credit transfers, retroactive to April 7, 2021, based on a proposed rule by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). However, PG&E has since communicated with staff that they are open to recognizing the 4,323,712 work credits purchased by the Town provided that the CPUC does not expressly prohibit the activity as part of its proposed rule. As currently proposed, the CPUC would only prohibit these type of transfers after its proposed rule goes into effect, which would be May 20, 2021 at the earliest. Thus, staff is cautiously optimistic about the acquisition of the 4.3M work credits. We will continue to monitor the rulemaking process for the Rule 20A Program and provide another update after the CPUC's May 20th meeting.

East Sunset Drive Roadway Improvements Update

During the month of April, the Town's surveyor completed survey work to locate the public right-of-way and on May 3rd, Cotton & Shires completed geotechnical borings along East Sunset Drive. The samples have been set to the lab and test results should be provided in the next 1-2 weeks, with a full geotechnical investigation report provided to the Town around 30 days after the test results have been received. This report will instruct Engineering staff on how to proceed with safety improvements to East Sunset Drive. Further updates will be provided once the geotechnical report has been completed and reviewed by staff.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Monthly Activity Report

For the month of April, a total of 12 new cases were opened, with five getting resolved, two curtesy notices sent, one verbal notice provided and four with ongoing investigations. This is in addition to the ongoing cases that Code Enforcement is managing. The detailed Monthly Activity Report is attached. Moving forward, Code Enforcement Activity Report will be provided on a monthly basis, with a Year-End Report (fiscal year) provided in July.

PLANNING AND BUILDING

Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for Permanente Creek Restoration Project

The County of Santa Clara has initiated the preparation of a Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (SEIR) to the 2012 Lehigh Permanente Quarry Reclamation Plan Amendment EIR for the Permanente Creek Restoration Project and issued a Notice of Preparation (NOP) at the beginning of April. RE: Rule 20A Work Credits Transfer Agreements- Los Altos Hills El Monte Fire Station Undergrounding Project

Dear Mr. Norimoto:

The Town of Los Altos Hills (“Town”) is in receipt of correspondences from Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) regarding the Town’s desire to purchase Rule 20A Work Credits from certain northern California jurisdictions and utilize such credits for the El Monte Fire Station Undergrounding Project. Specifically, most recently in an email dated April 26, 2021, PG&E reiterates that it will not recognize any Rule 20A credit transfers. In support of that position, PG&E cites to a draft decision by the California Public Utilities Commission (“CPUC”) published for public review and comment on April 7, 2021. This draft decision would propose to prohibit the sale and transfer of work credits between local agencies. However, given that the CPUC decision has not yet to be adopted, and that the Town has relied significantly on its ability to purchase Rule 20A credits from other public agencies to complete crucial utility undergrounding projects, we are writing to demand that PG&E continue to recognize credit transfers that were negotiated, and for which an agreement was duly executed, prior to the effective date of a CPUC decision.

For many years, PG&E has permitted municipalities to trade or sell unencumbered work credits pursuant to the PG&E Rule 20A Program. These credit trading and transfers are carried out in a transparent manner, based on mutually agreeable rates of exchange, and are memorialized in formal agreements between municipalities. As PG&E is aware, the ability to purchase and transfer credits has always been a critical component for many jurisdictions to complete eligible Rule 20A projects and PG&E has consistently approved this practice. In particular, the completion of these undergrounding projects is essential for communities that are located in rural or semi-rural settings and are at risk of elevated fire hazards.

The Town is a heavily wooded, semi-rural residential community that is surrounded by undeveloped open space and hills. It is also located in close proximity to areas with Extreme and Elevated fire risks as denoted on the CPUC 2019 Fire Threat Map. The Town has relied on the Rule 20A program in past years to fund its undergrounding projects, which are significant in mitigating

wildfire hazards around Los Altos Hills and in providing PG&E ratepayers with stable and safe utility service.

Most recently in 2019, the Town formed an underground utility district encompassing the El Monte Fire Station area to underground all existing overhead communication and electric distribution facilities within the district boundaries. With the district's formation, the Town notified and has since engaged in open discussions with PG&E regarding its intent to purchase Rule 20A work credits from other jurisdictions and utilize such transferred credits to fund the El Monte project. The abrupt denial of the Town's ability to purchase and utilize additional work credits would effectively terminate the undergrounding project.

We wish to emphasize that the draft CPUC decision has not been adopted and is not currently in effect. In fact, the text of the draft decision specifically noted that **“until and unless the [CPUC] hears the item and votes to approve it, the proposed decision has no legal effect”** (emphasis added). The CPUC is not scheduled to consider the proposed decision until May 20, 2021. Further, the draft order does not contain any provision that would apply a prohibition against credits trading retroactively. Thus, PG&E is not prohibited by any law, regulation, or administrative ruling to recognize a mutually negotiated work credit transfer agreement executed prior to a CPUC decision becoming effective.

Indeed, PG&E's unilateral decision to institute a prohibition prior to any formal legal decision creates an inequitable consequence for the Town and other similarly situated communities. It arbitrarily imposes a ban on a widely-utilized practice that has consistently been approved by PG&E in the past, and unduly prejudices the Town when it has remained transparent with PG&E in moving forward with a proposal to purchase work credits from other jurisdictions and has relied on that process to complete a crucial undergrounding project. This is particularly true when, as recently as April 2, 2021, PG&E representatives have exchanged emails with municipal staff explicitly stating that “Rule 20A credit exchanges between municipalities are allowed” and such exchanges are strictly based on negotiations between the parties. Thus, such a hasty prohibition is not only arbitrary but also significantly cripples municipalities' ability to underground critical infrastructure to the benefit of ratepayers. These inequitable and harmful consequences are inconsistent with the goals of the Rule 20A Program. We urge PG&E to consider these inequitable impacts and continue to approve mutually agreed upon transfer agreements between communities executed prior to the effective date of a CPUC order.

The Town has executed three (3) Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) with the Counties of Mariposa and Trinity, and the City of Willows. Pursuant to these MOUs, the Town has purchased Rule 20A work credits as follows:

Mariposa County:	2,992,327 credits
City of Willows:	859,915 credits
Trinity County:	471,470 credits
Total:	4,323,712 credits

The executed MOUs with each jurisdiction are attached. For the foregoing reasons, the Town requests that PG&E recognize the transfer of credits as memorialized in these MOUs and

approve the transfer of these 4,323,712 work credits for utilization towards the Los Altos Hills El Monte Fire Station Undergrounding Project.

**RE: Notice of Preparation of Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for
Permanente Creek Restoration Project**

Dear Mr. Salisbury:

The Town of Los Altos Hills has reviewed the Notice of Preparation (NOP) for a Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (SEIR) to the 2012 Lehigh Permanente Quarry Reclamation Plan Amendment EIR for the Permanente Creek Restoration Project ("Project") and has the following comments:

1. The SEIR should consider the impacts of the proposed creek restoration activities with regards to all environmental considerations in CEQA Guidelines Appendix G, with special attention being paid to water quality, air quality, and biological resources.
2. While the restoration activities will improve the health of the riparian corridor, the SEIR should include detailed and specific mitigation measures for the restoration and demolition activities so that pollutants and sediments are not released into the creek or air. Specifically, the SEIR should require that the restoration and demolition activities be limited to dry months to further reduce potential impacts on water quality.
3. The SEIR should assess potential impacts beyond the area identified as the Reclamation Plan Area, with particular focus on potential downstream impacts.

Beyond the SEIR, the County should ensure that all listed authorizations and approvals are obtained for the Project; with no approvals deferred or any exceptions granted. Finally, the Town requests that the County continue to closely monitor the activities of the Lehigh Quarry and Cement Plant operations to ensure compliance with all Regional, State, and Federal regulations.
