

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT) TRAINING



In the event of an area wide disaster, critical infrastructure and emergency services will be impacted. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) academy trains residents to prepare for and respond to life-threatening events in their community. CERT members can mobilize neighborhood resources, deliver immediate assistance to victims, organize emergency communications and provide support to first responders.

What is CERT?

Each city has its own organized CERT program. CERT members prepare, organize and work together as a team to provide essential services to their community during and after a disaster. CERTs strengthen neighborhood resiliency and play a vital role in their City's disaster response efforts.

CERT Training

CERT training academies are offered in the communities served by the Santa Clara County Fire Department and rotate throughout the year. Some of the skills taught include organizing resources, medical operations, basic search and rescue, how to use a fire extinguisher and damage assessment.





L.I.F.E. File

➤ **L.I.F.E. File (Lifesaving Information For Emergencies)** enables emergency responders to quickly locate important information regarding a patients medical history

➤ **Instructions:**

- Complete L.I.F.E File form in English
- Fold & place form inside pouch
- Enclose advanced directive documents (DNR/ POLST) & pharmacy medication printouts
- Place pouch on front or side of refrigerator

CREATE YOUR WILDLAND FIRE ACTION PLAN

The plan must be familiar to all household members *well in advance* of a wildfire.



CHECKLIST:



Choose a designated emergency meeting place outside the hazard area. This is critical to know who is out safe.



Know & practice several different escape routes from your home and community.



Create an evacuation plan for pets and large animals (horses, livestock, etc.).



Build your family communication plan that designates an out-of-area friend or relative as a single point of contact in case of separation.

BE PREPARED:

- Ensure your family knows where and how to shut off the gas, electric, and water supply
- Assemble an emergency supply kit for each person
- Maintain a list of emergency contact numbers
- Keep an extra emergency supply kit in your vehicle
- Always maintain at least a half tank of gas in vehicles

ASSEMBLE A PORTABLE EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT



- ✓ Three-day supply of non-perishable food and three gallons of water per person
- ✓ Extra prescriptions or special medications
- ✓ Change of clothing, extra eyeglasses or contacts
- ✓ Extra set of car keys, credit cards, cash or travelers checks
- ✓ First aid kit / flash light / NOAA radio
- ✓ Copies of important documents (birth certificates, passports, etc.)
- ✓ Don't forget pet carriers, food and water!
- ✓ Always keep a sturdy pair of shoes and flashlight near your bed in case of a sudden evacuation at night.

DEAD TREE REMOVAL

LOS ALTOS HILLS COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT

- Dead or dying tree removal service is free for any resident (Includes all of LAH and the connected portions of unincorporated Santa Clara County)
- The LAHCFD's designated arborist must approve the removal (included are Oak and Eucalyptus trees)
- The LAHCFD will cover the removal cost if the District's license and insured tree company is used
- If you are a renter, the homeowner needs to sign the work order
- Request approval by sending a letter to the LAHCFD at PO Box 1766, Los Altos, CA 94023 or call the District at 650-949-1044, M-F 8am to 5pm



WILDFIRE IS COMING. ARE YOU READY?



Defensible Space is your property's front line defense against wildfire. Creating and maintaining defensible space around your home can dramatically increase your home's chance of surviving a wildfire and improves the safety of firefighters defending your property. 100 feet of defensible space is required by law.*

TWO ZONES MAKE UP THE REQUIRED 100 FEET OF DEFENSIBLE SPACE:

ZONE 1: 30 feet of Lean, Clean & Green

- 1 Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds.
- 2 Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- 3 Keep tree branches 10 feet away from your chimney and other trees.

ZONE 2: 30-100 feet of Reduced Fuel

- 4 Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- 5 Create horizontal spacing between shrubs and trees.
- 6 Create vertical spacing between grass, shrubs and trees.

Use Equipment Properly to Keep from Sparking a Wildfire

- 7 Mow before 10 a.m., and never on a hot or windy day. String trimmers are a safer option (vs. lawnmowers) for clearing vegetation.



VERTICAL SPACING

Large trees do not have to be cut and removed as long as all of the plants beneath them are removed. This eliminates a vertical "fire ladder."



HORIZONTAL SPACING

Create horizontal and vertical spacing between plants, the amount of spacing will depend on how steep the slope is and the size of the plants.
